- O Decent flag inventory; in 2017 purchased 3 sets of performance flags which were paid for by the school district
- O Depending on the show, may not have the right color/look
- O Lamiae tends to wear out more quickly than poly china silk
- o Approximate cost per flag is \$35-\$50

Costume

- O Dress/cardigan were purchased at a deep discount and they "work" depending on the theme of show
 - Hems are not cut so they can be adjusted for height
 - No dresses were purchased in 2017
