#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Fundraising Ideas

Ben contacted Lori Slings at Southeast Polk about how setting up their ATM in the schools worked. Ben will continue to look into the logistics of this idea with Wells Fargo and DC-G administration.

Ben reached out to several area schools about a mattress fundraiser. Local schools raised from \$8,000 to \$20,000. It has no input costs. Johnston has a sale scheduled in November. Ben will request the rep from the fundraising company come to our next meeting, and he will reach out to the directors at schools that have done the mattress fundraiser to see how simple the process truly was. It was noted that the school's show this year is Once Upon a Mattress.

It was suggested that all fundraisers be promoted as for all arts' needs rather than for specific items (e.g., band uniforms) so that more parents will be supportive. Instead, list multiple upcoming needs on promotions. Then FOFA could save toward the varying upcoming needs.

The group discussed revisiting the directors' 5-year plans to put together an official FOFA plan for how to save for each large-ticket need across multiple years.

Another idea presented was having people test drive cars for which the dealership pays \$20 per test drive. This idea will be considered further next year.

Mrs. Ellis suggested whether we might be able to "sell" front-row parking spots or front-row seats at shows. Other districts do auction items like this.

Sarah Schaeffer made a motion and Kathy Fortune seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:12 PM.
